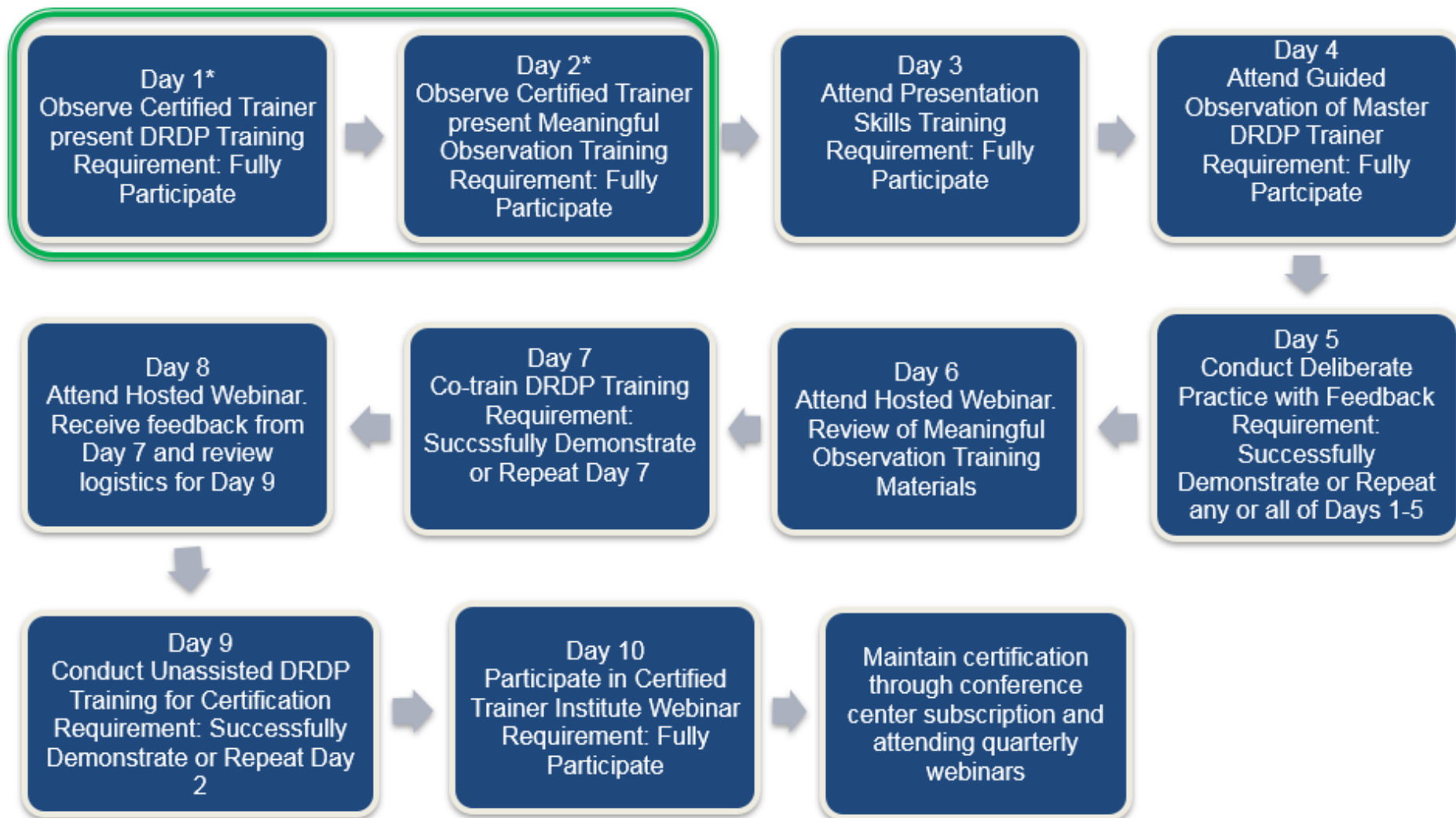


DRDP Certified Trainer Institute (CTI) Two Training Certification Process Graphic



*** Prerequisites: Complete Day 1 and Day 2 prior to classroom days or complete the five Desired Results modules at California Early Childhood Online (CECO).**

DRDP Certified Trainer Institute (CTI) Two Training Certification Process Graphic

Day 1—Observe a master trainer present the DRDP training. Prospective trainer fully engages as a participant.

Day 2—Observe master trainer present the Meaningful Observation training. Prospective trainer fully engages as a participant.

Day 3—Attend presentation skills training presented by the master coach and master trainer. Prospective trainers learn and practice strategies about presenting, keeping the audience engaged, and learning from a master coach.

Day 4—Attend guided observation of master DRDP trainer present the DRDP training. Prospective trainers observe master DRDP trainer while the master coach points out strategies and techniques learned in Presentation Skills training.

Day 5—Conduct guided study and reflection. Prospective trainers reflect on the training skills and content observed and study sections of the DRDP training with peers and the master coach. Currently, prospective trainers complete the DRDP Content Knowledge Assessment.

Day 6—Conduct deliberate practice with feedback. Prospective trainers practice content from the DRDP training and receive immediate feedback from peers, the master DRDP trainer, and the master coach. The prospective trainer receives written and oral feedback and is notified if he/she can proceed in the process or needs to repeat any, or all, of Days 1-6.

Day 7—Co-train DRDP training. The prospective trainer leads a DRDP training with the master trainer ready to intervene. This will be facilitated either with the master trainer or with another prospective trainer. The master trainer provides feedback throughout the training. An optional planning call will occur prior to the training. The prospective trainer receives notification if he/she can proceed in the process or needs to repeat co-training of DRDP training with the master trainer.

Day 8—Co-train Meaningful Observation training (as needed). The prospective trainer will lead a Meaningful Observation training with the Master Trainer ready to intervene. This will be facilitated either with the Master Trainer, or with another prospective trainer. The Master Trainer will provide feedback throughout the training and will give detailed feedback following the training. An optional WebEx planning call will occur prior to the training. The prospective trainer will receive notification if they can proceed in the process or need to repeat co-training of Meaningful Observation Training with the master trainer.

Day 9—Conduct Unassisted DRDP training for certification. The prospective trainer will lead a DRDP training with no intervention from the Master Trainer. The Master Trainer will provide detailed feedback at the end of the training. An optional WebEx planning call will occur prior to training. The prospective trainer will receive notification if they are certified or need to repeat the solo certification training with the Master Trainer.

Day 10—Participate in Certified Trainer Institute webinar. Certified trainers will participate in a webinar to gain access to the Desired Results Conference Center – a resource center for ongoing trainer support. Certification is then complete, and participant may train within agency or consortium.

Maintain certification through conference center subscription and attending quarterly webinars. To continue to maintain certification, certified trainers must attend quarterly webinars scheduled and provided by a master trainer and must continue a conference center subscription.
